THE CONVENT

Secretary of State Hugh Faulkner assures us that the ceiling of the chapel of the Rideau Street Convent will be incorporated into the new National Gallery. Most probably in the proposed reading room. His letter ends with the following:

BYWARD MARKET

The City's proposal for renovation of the Market Building was previewed at the last general meeting. It consists of replacement of the first storey of the building with a modern, arcaded brick structure. Although this is sympathetic with the new concrete parking garage across the street, it is unsympathetic to the structure we are trying to preserve. Heritage Ottawa suggested a complete restoration of the original structure.

HERITAGE DAY....HURRAY

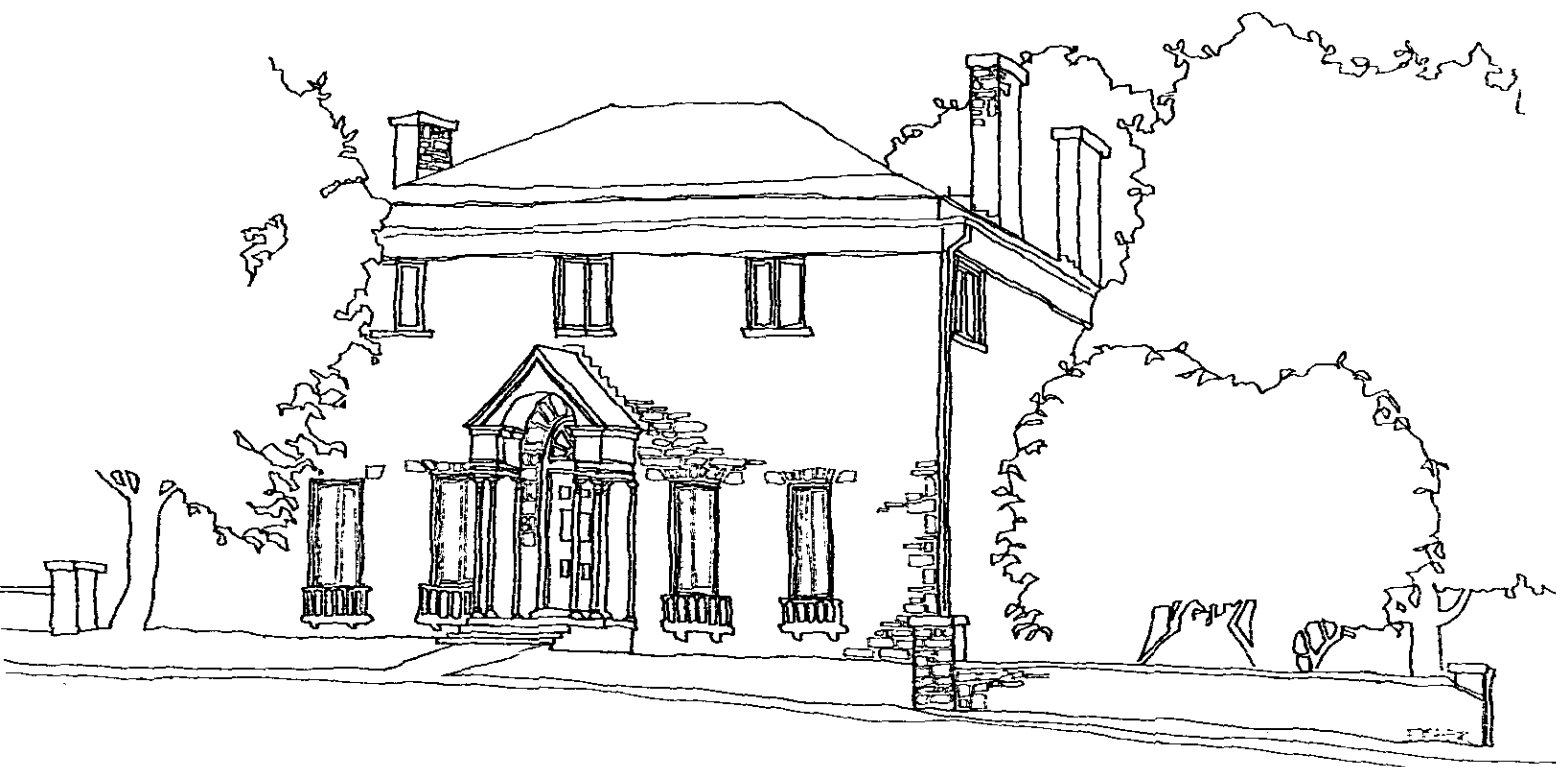

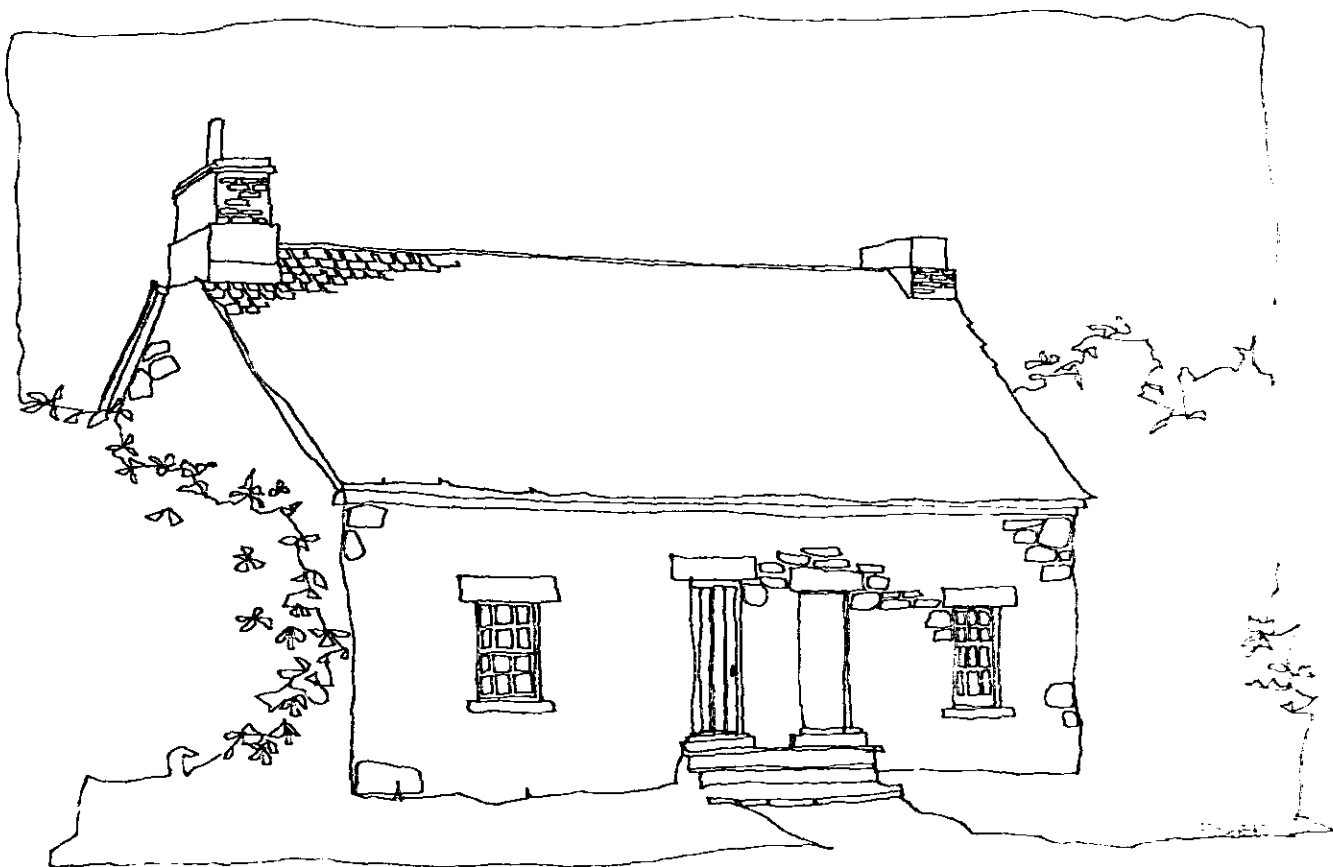
