OCTOBER GENERAL MEETING

The Alexandra Bridge and Other Heritage Bridges in Ottawa will be the topic of an illustrated talk by Jacques Beauchamp, Chief Bridge Engineer, Department of Public Works, at this month's meeting - Wednesday, October 26. Members are invited to meet at 8:00 in the City Archives Building, 174 Stanley Avenue, New Edinburgh. Formerly the St. Vincent de Paul Separate School, and built ca. 1930 with additions in 1960, the building has recently been adapted for archive use. Buses No. 3 and 83 serve the area.

HERITAGE OTTAWA GALLERY

"Looking Back - The Jewish Community in Ottawa." - Heritage Ottawa has been invited to serve on the Board of Directors of the Ottawa Heritage Development Corporation. Joan Mackie represented Heritage Ottawa on the pro-tem committee which worked to establish the Corporation.

- A group of lawyers has offered to renovate the Registry Office on Nicholas Street for their use.
