GLEBE HERITAGE SEMINARS


The Heritage Ottawa-Glebe Neighbourhood Plan seminars on June 7 and 14 were very well attended by residents of the Glebe. A total of seven speakers gave short talks on several aspects of the heritage of the neighbourhood and restoration techniques.

Clifford Ham, preservation planner with the Community Development Branch, City of Ottawa, spoke on the development of the Glebe and the heritage component of the Glebe Neighbourhood Plan. John Leaning, architect, described architectural styles in the Glebe. Halina Jeletzky, architectural historian, presented a methodology for researching the history of a building.

Harold Kalman, consultant in the history and conservation of architecture, spoke on sensitive rehabilitation and government programs. Jim Mooreman, Manager, Property Standards Division, City of Ottawa, described property standards for the maintenance of buildings. Gerry White, instructor in the Restoration Technology Program at Algonquin College, explained methods of exterior maintenance and restoration techniques. Milton Droseske, restoration contractor, added yet a further dimension to the subjects of exterior maintenance and restoration techniques.

Given the success of these two evenings, further seminars will be considered.
