DEMOLITION WARNING

It has come to the attention of the Board of Directors that application has been made for demolition of the Italianate Zeller's Building. The building is located on the South Side of Sparks Street and is owned by the Poulin Estate.

The block in which the Zeller's Blg is located is important to the heritage of the Central Area and its redevelopment with high rise office buildings would completely change the character of Sparks Street destroying its appeal as a pedestrian mall.
