## 17 YORK STREET

As reported in The Citizen this month, a vacant NCC building at 17 York Street will be renovated at a cost of \$1 million as offices for the Canadian Hospital Association.

Complete restoration of the building, which dates to 1802, began in November and is expected to be completed in March of this year.

## MARTINEAU HOTEL

Also reported in The Citizen this month, the Martineau Hotel (at the corner of Murray and Parent Streets) will be restored following a fire which gutted the building in 1979.

The new building will be named The Carriageway House and will feature a new six-storey addition at the rear. The addition will be built with similar stone facing and in complementary architecture.

Built in 1871 by then Ottawa mayor Eugene Martineau, the structure housed a variety of boarding hostels until 1972. The 1979 fire destroyed earlier attempts to restore the building. The present restoration is welcomed (although, from a personal point of view, I don't understand why the name, with decades of history attached to it, has to be changed) and should be completed by May 1983.

Members were invited to view the draft of the book December 14 and comment on its contents. All reaction to the book is favourable, and John hopes to have it in the hands of the publishers in the next few months.

## GATINEAU HISTORICAL SOCIETY MEETING

Heritage Ottawa members will recall that Arthur Davison, President of the Gatineau Historical Society, attended Heritage-Canada's annual meeting in Regina in October 1982 on behalf of the Society and Heritage Ottawa. On December 2, Heritage Ottawa board members joined the Gatineau Historical Society at the NRC auditorium to hear Mr. Davison's report on the conference as well as a very interesting talk on Heritage Canada's programmes by Albert Benoit, Director of Information and Public Relations for Heritage Canada.

Mr. Davison's lively report was followed by "Maple Creek", the excellent Saskatchewan Government film which had been featured at the Regina conference.

Mr. Benoit's talk included a description of Heritage Canada's Main Street Programme, which aims to revitalize the commercial cores of smaller Canadian towns. He highlighted his presentation with a film showing the spruced-up main street of Perth, one of the six towns across Canada included in the 1982-83 programme.

While preservation of the architectural heritage is certainly an important component of the Programme, Heritage Canada also encourages the merchants involved to take a critical look at their merchandise and methods of display, and to work together as a group, viewing their competition as coming from other areas rather than from the merchant across the street or next door.

Mr. Benoit stressed that the Main Street Programme's approach was an inexpensive, non-capital-intensive way of revitalizing the downtown core, and mentioned that, over a 2-year period, the project in Perth had generated \$14 in private investment for every dollar spent in the community by Heritage Canada.
